Subject: Settlement of intervening period of undergoing higher studies in favour of Dr. Irfan Ali, the then Assistant Surgeon/Medical Officer.

Government Order No. 1066-JK (HME) of 2023
Dated: 20.12.2023

WHEREAS, Principal, Government Medical College, Srinagar vide communication No. GS-MC/Assoc/Med/259 dated 11.05.2023 forwarded the copy of representation submitted by Dr. Irfan Ali, Associate Professor, Department of Medicine, Government Medical College, Srinagar, requesting therein to treat the study period of pursuing PG as 'on deputation' in terms of Government Order No. 673-HME of 2001 dated 17-06-2001, on the analogy of other appointees of Government Order No. 702-HME of 2001 dated 04.10.2001, as the same benefits were given to them;

AND WHEREAS, vide letter dated 06.06.2023, comments/ views in the matter were sought from Director, Health Services, Jammu, who in turn vide communication dated 06.10.2023 intimated that the period of Post-Graduation of one Dr. Rajesh Angral, Consultant Anaesthesia, who was also appointed as Medical Officer vide Government Order No. 702-HME of 2001, dated 04.10.2001, has been considered as 'on deputation' vide Government Order No. 146-HME of 2018 dated 22.02.2018. It has been further requested to consider the request of Dr. Irfan Ali, Associated Professor, Government Medical College, Srinagar, on the analogy of Dr. Rajesh Angral;

AND WHEREAS, one Dr. Rajesh Angral, who was also appointed as Assistant Surgeon/Medical Officer vide Government Order No. 702-HME of 2001 dated 04.10.2001, had requested to extend the benefit of Government Order No. 673-HME of 2001 dated 17.06.2001 by treating the period of PG course in his favour w.e.f. 19.10.2001 to



23.02.2004 as 'on deputation'. Subsequently, as per approval conveyed by the Administrative Department vide communication No. HD/Legal/Gaz/29/MR-845/2011-13/K dated 15.04.2014, the period spent on PG by Dr. Rajesh Angral in Government Medical College, Jammu w.e.f. 19.10.2001 to 23.02.2004 was treated as 'on deputation' vide Government Order No.146-HME of 2018 dated 22.02.2018;

AND WHEREAS, the case of Dr. Irfan Ali has been examined on the analogy of Dr. Rajesh Angral and it has been observed that in the year 2001, Dr. Irfan Ali got selected for pursuing MD Medicine in Government Medical College, Jammu and, subsequently, joined the same. Further, the doctor was appointed as Assistant Surgeon/Medical Officer vide Government Order No. 702-HME of 2001 dated 04.10.2001 at serial No. 182 and submitted his joining report on 18.10.2001 in Government Medical College, Jammu which was duly forwarded to Director, Health Services Jammu by the then Principal/Dean, Government Medical College, Jammu vide letter No. JMC/FAC/PG/34 dated 22.10.2001;

AND WHEREAS, vide communication No. HD(Gaz)67/2001 dated 20.01.2003, it was ordered that the Assistant Surgeons appointed in pursuance to Government Order No. 702-HME of 2001 dated 04.10.2001, who were undergoing Post Graduation in Government Medical College Jammu/Srinagar and SKIMS shall continue in the respective institutions till completion of their courses. They will report to Director, Health Services, Kashmir/Jammu, as the case may be, for further posting after completion of their courses. During the period of their study, they shall be allowed stipend as admissible to them under rules;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to above order, the aforesaid doctor continued to pursue his PG course and after completion of said course was relieved by the then Principal, Government Medical College, Jammu vide Order No. 146 of 2004 dated 20.02.2004, and, subsequently, he physically joined at Directorate of Health Services, Jammu on 20.02.2004 for further posting/duties;

AND WHEREAS, vide Government Order No. 673-HME of 2001 dated 24.09.2001, it was ordered that the doctors who on the eve of their appointment vide Government Order No. 710-HME of 1997 dated 12.08.1997 were doing PG courses at Government Medical College, Jammu/Srinagar shall be treated as in-service candidates on deputation to PG Course from the date of their appointment as Assistant Surgeons and the emoluments drawn treated as stipend as a one-time dispensation;



AND WHEREAS, vide communication No. HD/Legal/Gaz/29/MR-845/2011-13/K dated 15.04.2014, all the HODs were advised to treat the period of PG/Super Specialist Medical Courses as spent on deputation in favour of in-service doctors on the basis of their selection by the concerned selection agency prior to 29.05.2013, where after the period of study of such doctors shall be governed by SRO 274 dated 30.05.2013 issued by the Finance Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, sanction is hereby accorded to treat the period of undergoing PG course from Government Medical College, Jammu w.e.f. 18.10.2001 to 20.02.2004 in favour of Dr. Irfan Ali, the then Assistant Surgeon/Medical Officer as 'on deputation' in light of the Government Order No. 673-HME of 2001 dated 17.06.2001 read with communication No. HD/Legal/Gaz/29/MR-845/2011-13/K dated 15.04.2014.
