**WRITE UP IN RESPECT OF GOVT. MEDICAL COLLEGE & ITS
ASSOCIATED HOSPITALS, JAMMU.**

- i. Government Medical College, Jammu, a premier institute of J&K (Union Territory) was started in the year 1973 in a temporary building with the object to provide quality education and deliver quality health care service to the people of the region. This institution is located in the heart of Temple City Jammu. The initial intake capacity of the college was fifty medical students for MBBS course per year, which has since increased to 180 MBBS seats. Besides, MBBS course the college is also imparting Post-graduate training Course which presently has 198 seats per year.
- ii. With the inauguration of Medical College Hospital building in the year of 1993, the bed capacity has since increased from 900 to 3150 with coming up of 05 Associated Hospitals namely CD Hospital, SMGS Hospital, Psychiatric Diseases Hospital, Super Specialty Hospital, Maternity Hospital Gandhi Nagar and the newly established 500 bedded COVID dedicated DRDO hospital.
- iii. At present, Govt. Medical College, Jammu and its associated hospitals are catering to the patients from whole of Jammu province, part of Kashmir valley and adjoining areas of neighboring states of Punjab and Himachal Pradesh.

(I) Brief profile of Associated Hospitals of GMC, Jammu

1. GOVERNMENT MEDICAL COLLEGE HOSPITAL, JAMMU

- i. Medical College Hospital was inaugurated in the year 1993 with bed strength of 850 beds including Col. R.N.Chopra Nursing Home.
- ii. Bed Capacity: 1192
- iii. SPECIALIZATION: Medicine, Surgery, Ophthalmology, Orthopaedics, Radiology, Radiotherapy, Anesthesiology, Blood Transfusion, Pathology, Microbiology, Bio-Chemistry, Physiotherapy, Forensic Medicine and Emergency services related to Medicine, Surgery, Ophthalmology and Orthopaedics.

2. Govt. SMGS HOSPITAL, JAMMU

- i. Shri Maharaja Hari Singh established SMGS (Sri Maharaja Gulab Singh Hospital) which was inaugurated on 06-05-1940. When Medical College started, SMGS Hospital was attached with GMC for teaching purpose.
- ii. Bed Capacity: 750 (Including 89 ICU beds)
- iii. SPECIALIZATION: Paediatric, Obst. & Gynaecology, ENT, Dermatology and related Emergency Services.

3. GOVT SUPER SPECIALITY HOSPITAL, JAMMU

- i. A Multi specialty hospital inaugurated on 3rd March, 2014 as an upgradation of Govt. Medical College, Jammu under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana to provide super specialty services to the people.
- ii. Bed Capacity: 250.
- iii. SPECIALIZATION: Urology, Nephrology, Cardiology, CTVS, Neurology, Neuro Surgery and Endocrinology (Seven Departments).

4. GOVT. CHEST DISEASES HOSPITAL, JAMMU

- i. Chest Diseases Hospital was established in 1955 for catering to the chest diseases related issues.
- ii. The Indoor facility of the hospital comprises of male and female wards with special ward for intensive care treatment, and Minor Operation Theatre where Chest procedures like Bronchoscopy, pleural aspiration, Intercostal Intubations, Pleural Biopsies and FNAC are done.
- iii. Bed Capacity: 140.
- iv. SPECIALIZATION: Chest Diseases and Tuberculosis.

5. GOVT. MATERNITY HOSPITAL, JAMMU

- i. Maternity Hospital was designated as Dedicated COVID Hospital (DCH) in April, 2020.
- ii. Hospital commenced its operations as a level 3 COVID facility during 1st wave of COVID-19 pandemic from 7th June, 2020. Operation theatre and Level-1 COVID facility were started during 2nd wave of COVID-19 Pandemic from 20th April, 2021.
- iii. Bed Capacity: 200.
- iv. SPECIALIZATION: Maternal (Obs. & Gynaecology) & Child (Paediatrics) care.

6. GOVT. PSYCHIATRY DISEASES HOSPITAL

- i. Psychiatric diseases Hospital was established in 1964 at Amphalla, as a tertiary care hospital. The hospital is now functioning in new building at Resham Ghar Colony since 2015.
- ii. Bed Capacity: 120 beds.
- iii. SPECIALIZATION: Psychiatric disease treatment and counselling, De-addiction centre & Opioid Substitution Therapy (OST).

(II) RECENT MAJOR/MINOR ACHIEVEMENTS

(A) Academic, Research & Medical Science

- i. B. Sc Nursing course introduced with intake capacity of 80 seats per year.
- ii. DNB courses started in 4 Departments: Urology, Cardiology, Neuro Surgery and Bio- Chemistry.
- iii. DNB Courses have recently been sanctioned in Psychiatry, Hospital Administration, and Neurology.
- iv. New courses started from current year 2021-22: B.Sc Paramedical course with intake capacity of 110 students per year.
- v. Starting of Dialysis services for COVID-19 patients in HDU ward of GMCH, Jammu.
- vi. Starting of pediatric dialysis services at SMGS Hospital, Jammu.
- vii. First time Dual chamber ICD implanted with state of the art technology in Cardiology Dept, SS Hospital, Jammu.
- viii. First Time ultrasound guided celiac plexus neurolysis via anterior approach in a patient with colon malignancy.
- ix. First Time starting of 3-D Laparoscopy Surgery in SSH in the Department of Urology.
- x. World Record of saving baby weighing 450 grams (24 weeks), Department of Paediatrics SMGS Hospital, Jammu.

- xi. Start of Mental Health & Psycho Social support for children- Project funded by UNICEF
- xii. Up-gradation of ENT Department & making available navigation system for doing Functional Endoscopic Sinus Surgery (FESS).
- xiii. First surgery using the navigation system and the first surgery using facial nerve monitoring performed.
- xiv. Starting of COVID-19 Bio markers & antibody testing in GMC, Jammu.
- xv. First Bilateral Cochlear implant Surgery on a 06 years old child on 17-08-2021.

(B) Infrastructure

- i. A new additional 100 bedded Emergency block has been made functional in GMCH, Jammu to strengthen the Tertiary Care Level health care facility and was inaugurated by the Hon'ble LG on 15th July, 2021. The project has been completed at an estimated of Rs. 1150.71 lacs. It is having 64 ICU beds in 1st and 2nd floor with ventilators facilities. Rest of 32 beds are being utilized for emergency pertaining to the department of Medicine. All the 96 beds have been provided with Monitors to monitor health parameters of the patients with centrally air conditioned facility.
- ii. DRDO 500 bedded Covid hospital at Bhagwati Nagar, Jammu has been established and is fully functional. It was Inaugurated by the Hon'ble LG on 29th May, 2021 and dedicated to the people of J&K. the hospital has 125 ICU Beds while rest of the beds have provision of 24x7 Oxygen supply from 2 LMO plants each having 20 KL capacity. The hospital is equipped with ventilators, monitors, in-house pharmacy, diagnostic facility, full-fledged laboratory, X-ray & CT- Scan machine.
- v. Maternity Hospital Gandhi Nagar, Jammu was completed at an estimated cost of Rs. 50.00 Cr. by the PWD (R&B) Deptt. & designated as dedicated COVID Hospital in April 2020. Hospital commenced its operations as a level 3 COVID facility during Ist wave of COVID-19 pandemic from 7th June, 2020. Operation theatre and Level-1 COVID facility were started during 2nd wave of COVID-19 Pandemic from 20th April, 2021.
- vi. Hon'ble LG dedicated Govt. Ayurvedic Medical College to people of J&K on 14th July, 2021 at Akhnoor which has been constructed at a cost of Rs 2580 lacs. More than 100 types of Ayurvedic Medicines, oils and life saving drugs and oxygen concentrators are available in 60 bedded hospital. The hospital has fully equipped 02- Operation Theatres and 01 Labour room, besides 06 smart lecture halls, Conference hall with more than 100 sitting capacity and a fully furnished Yoga hall.
- iii. Dedicated Medical Oxygen Generation Plants established at GMCH and all the Associated Hospitals and their capacity has been increased from initial capacity of 2450 LPM to 22675 LPM in GMC and its Associated Hospital, Jammu. Besides, 60 KL LMO is also functional at GMCH, Jammu & DRDO Hospital, Jammu (01 No.-20 KL in GMCH & 02 Nos- 20 KL each in DRDO).
- iv. Installation of copper pipeline and additional oxygen gas points in Govt. Maternity Hospital to make 20 ICU (NICU & PICU) and 20 Gyane ICUs fully functional.
- v. 1st VRDL lab in J&K UT established in GMCH, Jammu.

- vi. Establishment of 08 RTPCR Labs.
- vii. Establishment of COBAS State of Art lab.
- viii. Establishment of speciality ICU's in Department of Paediatrics, Obst. & Gynae. & ENT.
- ix. Up gradation of Ortho OT complex into modular theater complex.
- x. Installation of temporal bone dissection & skull based surgeries Lab in ENT Department.
- xi. Procurement and installation of 578 High end ventilator & 51 Transport Ventilator (Mobile).

6. Making the institutions under the Directorate capable of handling emergencies particularly disaster situation.

8. Advocating for a change in the conceptualization and planning processes for the health sector for making it more need oriented and based on the actual unmet needs with modern planning techniques.
9. Creating Effective Public Private Partnerships for management and technological transfer of expertise into the health system.
10. Encouraging the hospitals and health facilities to innovate and replicate any good practices.

Major Achievements:

ICU Status:

Intensive care units have been established in all district hospitals.

Addiction Treatment Facilities:

Under the recently launched Nasha Mukht Bharat Scheme 5 Addiction treatment facilities have been established at Budgam, Bandipora, Pulwama, Shopian & Kulgam in Aug 2021

Dialysis:

Under the Pradhan Mantri Dialysis program all the District Hospitals have established Dialysis Centers and as of date more than 15000 dialysis sessions have been conducted

Academics:

- District DNB program 9 District and sub-district hospitals are at various stages of seeking accreditation for various disciplines.
- Up gradation of 5 ANM/ GNM schools to the level of Nursing Colleges.
- Thirteen Hundred students currently undergoing various paramedical courses.

Trauma Care:

- All the District Hospital's and Sub-District Hospitals have established specialized Emergency Rooms
- Provisioning of appropriate services during the Golden Hour.
- Training of Doctors and Paramedics in Basic and Advanced trauma and cardiac life support and Obstetrical skills.
- Regional Institute of health and Family Welfare, recognized nationally for innovating to impart these trainings.

Tertiary Care Services:

- Medical and surgical services have been upgraded and Operating Theatres, Blood banks, laboratories, radiology have been equipped.
- High quality tertiary level surgeries are routinely being conducted in most hospitals
- Laparoscopic surgery is available in the entire District and most of the Sub-District level Hospitals.
- Advanced interventions including pacemaker implants, advanced joint replacement and spine surgeries etc. available in some centers
- Recently some of our health care institutions were awarded under the Kayakalp programme of quality assurance by Government of India.

Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra:

The Director Health Services, Kashmir is also entrusted with the medical arrangements for Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra. Specialties like Critical Care, Orthopedics, and Surgical Services & Physicians are available at Base Hospitals. There is a Health facility after every 1.5 Kms.

Jan Aushadi:

140 Jan Aushadi Kendras has been established in phase wise manner in all districts of Kashmir Division

Blood Centers:

Blood centers has been established in all Districts of Kashmir division

DNB Institutions:

6 District Hospitals & 2 SubDistrict Hospitals has been identified for District Residency Programmes out of which 2 District Hospitals & 1 Subdistrict Hospital has been started DNB Programmes which include JLNM hospital Rainawari, District Hospital Kulgam & SDH Kupwara in year 2021-22

COVID19 Activities:

- 2008 Covid dedicated beds In 18 facilities made available with High Flow Oxygen delivery
- Total oxygen generation capacity of enhanced from 900 lpm to 30000 lpm till date in 29 institutions.
- 6817 Oxygen Concentrators, 2726 oxygen cylinders (1716 bulk cylinders) available
- During the second wave the referral rate from the Districts to the tertiary level has come down from 17% to 12%
- A total of 97.8 lac tests have been done till date which include 22 lac rt-PCR tests.
- Special sampling points in all major hospitals, courts, recreational places, and other places in addition to the sampling being routinely conducted in containment zones and random sampling in offices, shopping centres etc.
- Total COVID positive cases about 2.70 lacs out of which 2.34 lacs have been cured. Deaths due to the COVID has been 2379
- Case fatality rate of less than 1.1 % as compared to the National CFR of 1.3%.

Department of Orthopedics

The department of Orthopedics was already working in the District Hospital Baramulla and has been fully functional with the starting of this Medical College. This is one of the departments who is having full-fledged staff from consultants to Junior Residents since the starting of the College. The Department consists of One-Professor, One-Associate Professor, Two-Assistant professor, Five-Senior Residents and Five-Junior Residents.

Achievements: -

We have been catering regular OPDs even during these COVID times and routine orthopedic OTs. The major achievements of the department are that we have done all major surgeries during the last two years.

1. Spine: -
 - a) Routine disc surgeries
 - b) Correction of Spondylolisthesis (Slip of bone)
 - c) Excision of spinal tumor benign
 - d) Fixation of fractures.
2. Fixation of all limb fractures.
3. Total knee & total Hip replacement.
4. High Tibial osteotomy
5. Correction of Torticollis.

The above mentioned procedures are fully in our record.

We are also contributing to the National Rural Health Programme of GOI by weekly visiting the rural PHCs attached with the GMC Baramulla. The department is continuously striving for research & innovation; we were successful in publishing 14 publications in reputed journals of the world even during these COVID times.

We couldn't take the orthopedic emergencies on full-fledged basis as we are lacking the requisite staff like OT Technicians, C-Arm technicians, Implants, anesthesia cover and proper OT table. These things are expected as this is a new medical college and we expect things will improve in near future.

Brief Introductory Note

The department of Pharmacology, Govt. Medical College Baramulla came into existence in the year 2019. The aim of this Department is to generate trained manpower to improve doctor, patient ratio and make available quality research to provide Evidence Based Medicine. Our Vision statement for the Department is as under:

01. Provide quality education and competency based learning in Students.
02. Promoting safe and efficacious use of medicines at a cost the Community and the individuals can afford.
03. Provide Pharmacovigilance services.
04. Providing Therapeutic Drug Monitoring Services to end user Departments.
05. Promotion of generic prescribing.
06. Promotion of Rational Prescribing and drug use audit.
07. Continuing Research for optimal use of Medicines which will be Evidence Based and tailor made.
08. Curtailing drug abuse and drug de-addiction services.
09. Continuing Medical Education.

The department has recently been granted ADRM Centre under PVPI, Central Drug Standard Control Organization, Directorate General of Health services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India. The future vision is to work and strengthen on post-graduate research and generate high quality/ impact factor research from the department making the department of pharmacology citable across the globe and to start the Toxicology Information Centre from the department. To include various innovative ideas in medical graduate and post graduate teaching programme is also one of the departmental future strategies with the aim to groom them as basic prescription competent and confident doctors and researchers.

Major Achievements:-

Department of ENT

Brief introduction

Department of ENT is providing six days a week OPD services in its OPD section “B1” and 24x7 emergency ENT services to the patients. The department is fully equipped with a minor procedure room also. Besides this Audiometry and speech therapy is running on all OPD days in room no 104. Our department is performing all the major ENT & head neck surgery operations.

Manpower strength of our department is as follows:

One professor, one Associate professor, one Assistant professor, two senior residents, three junior residents, two audiometric technicians, one computer operator cum clerk, one nursing orderly, one class iv employee and one helper.

Achievements

Our department is conducting many research projects which are in various phases of research/publication. During current year our department started temporal bone dissection lab also and our department received permission from NBE for 3 diploma students from current academic year.

During current year our department received various batches of undergraduate students for their clinical posting. Our faculty members imparted clinical skills to the students in accordance with CBME.

Faculty members of our department participated in many webinars throughout the year.

During the Year 2021 referrals reduced to 07 per year.

Our department was on for front during Covid 19 pandemic and all the faculty members, senior residents, junior residents and paramedical staff gave their 100% services in this pandemic.

Our department received state of art equipment which includes high definition camera and monitor for endoscopic sinus surgery, high end oto microscope, Navigation system, nerve integrity monitor, harmonic cautery and many more.

Department of ENT extended its OPD services in far flung areas by sending specialist doctors to PHC Kalantra on every alternate week.

In addition to the entire routine ENT Surgical procedures department is performing Head and Neck cancer surgeries on regular basis.

Department of ENT submitted proposal for starting cochlear implant surgeries to ADIP central office Mumbai.



Department Chest Medicine

Introduction:-

The Speciality of Chest Medicine deals with a gamut of diseases that involve the lungs, airways, mediastinum, pleura, diaphragm and the chest wall. Not only thoracic, but disorders that affect the breathing indirectly like neuromuscular disorders, sleep disorders are also part of the specialty.

The burden of chest diseases is increasing with growing urbanization, pollution and due to harmful effects of smoking. The diseases that we encounter commonly in our population for which chest medicine services are required are Asthma, COPD, Bronchiectasis, Tuberculosis, Pneumonias, Chest traumas, Pneumothorax, Pleural effusions, Mediastinal lymph adenopathy, Lung cancer, Sleep disorders, Allergies, and Respiratory failure due to various causes.

The Department of Chest Medicine has been functional at Government Medical College, Baramulla Hospital since 2019. It provides all that is necessary for high quality care of patients, viz, excellent manpower resources in its consultants. State-of-the-art equipment required for diagnosis and treatment of respiratory diseases, a humane approach combined with total dedications and academic activities to always remain abreast with the latest developments in the field of respiratory medicine.

Research in Progress:-

Our Department is well equipped to deal with preventive, diagnostic, emergency and rehabilitative aspects of Chest Medicine is to provide quality and comprehensive care for our patients which is comparable to best in the Jammu and Kashmir.

Academic Activities:-

Our Department trains MBBS students every year. The department has an organized academic program supervised by the consultant for both theoretical and practical training. There are presentations, seminars, bedside case presentations for medical and paramedical students.

Department of Community Medicine

Introduction

The Discipline of Community Medicine is an integral and a vital component of Medical Education and Healthcare Delivery System. It acts as a connecting link between the medical college and the surrounding community. Besides involvement in patient care, medical education and research, department is vigilant in keenly observing the emergence of outbreaks, epidemics and new diseases in the community and ready for the combat. The department has an expertise in providing assistance in research methodology and statistical analysis. The mission of this field of medicine is achievement of ideal state of health and wellness and achieving a disease free and healthy society.

Major achievements

1. 10 original research papers published and 6 Paper/Poster presentations.
2. 8276 COVID-19 vaccine doses administered among various beneficiaries.
3. Supervised 1st and 2nd Serosurvey of SARSCoV in District Kupwara and Baramulla.
4. Preventive health check-up of around 1500 people in 6 health camps conducted pre COVID-19 pandemic.
5. Organized Medical cum awareness camp on palliative care and Mental health awareness cum screening camp.
6. Training programs on BMW management and tobacco control program.
7. Outbreak investigation of gastroenteritis in inmates of district jail Baramulla.
8. Guest Speaker in Webinar on Food safety in disasters



Department of Pediatrics

The Department of Pediatrics of the newly established Government Medical College Baramulla has been entrusted with the job of providing medical care and health guidance to the pediatric population of Kashmir Valley in general and that of Baramulla, Bandipora and Kupwara districts in particular. This is in addition to imparting medical training to the undergraduate students and health care workers involved in providing primary health care services to the population at grassroot levels. The department has taken up the reins of this responsibility from the erstwhile District Hospital Baramulla whose existing infrastructure was incorporated into the newly designated Associated Hospital of the Government Medical College Baramulla in 2018 and since then the facilities are being continuously upgraded.

The Department of Pediatrics boasts of a full-time faculty of senior consultants including One Professor, One Associate Professor, Three Assistant Professors, One Child Psychologist and three Pediatric Specialists. Besides there are 1 Senior Resident, 6 Junior Residents, 8 Medical Officers and more than 20 Nurses in addition to an workforce of counsellors and social workers, technical, ministerial and janitorial staff who work as a cohesive unit providing best possible service to the patients.

The department provides essential and emergency newborn care, immunizations, general pediatric inpatient and outpatient care and guidance and counselling services to the whole pediatric population of Northern Kashmir with a watershed area extending from Budgam to Uri and Gulmarg to Kupwara. The department has a fully functional 10 bedded Special Newborn Care Unit (SNCU) for infants upto 1 month of age that is in the process of being upgraded to a Level 3 Neonatal ICU. Associated with the SNCU is an ancillary section of Family Participatory Care (FPC) that aims at family involvement in the care of newborns admitted in the SNCU and provides counselling and training to the mothers of newborn babies about Breastfeeding, Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) and home care of babies using audio-visual aids.

The Emergency area includes a fully equipped Emergency Triage, Assessment and Treatment (ETAT) area where 24x7 emergency services are provided. The Pediatric Ward has 24 General Beds out of which 6 beds are dedicated as High Dependency Unit (HDU) where care is provided to children in need of more intensive monitoring. A fully equipped Level 2 Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) is on the cards and will be functional shortly as the necessary infrastructure is being put into place.

Achievements in Current Year.

- Organised one day CME on AFP and MR Surveillance in Collaboration with WHO county office.
- All the Faculty members of our Department participated in Revised Basic Course Workshop (RBCW) at GMC Baramulla and one of Faculty members participated in same Workshop at CMC Ludhiana and is now imparting training to faculty.

Department of Ophthalmology

The department of Ophthalmology of GMC Baramulla entertrents 45000-50000 patients per year in out patient department and 1500 surgeries are done approximately per year. The outpatient department does provide the diagnostic services of Autorefractometry, refraction, Tonometry (Indentation and applination), funduscopy, Keratometry, A scan Biometry. The OPD also provides services of therapeutic department runs Eye theatre 6 days week.

Slitlamp, Biomicroscopy, Direct funduscopy, indirect YAG Laser capsulotomy and YAG laser Iridotomy. The In the current year w.e.f April,2021 we have performed 860 surgeries, 360 Yag Laser Capsulatomies, 100 Yag Laser iridotomies, 1300 AScans, 10912 Refractions, 500 Gonioscopies, 1200 Indirect Ophthalmoscopies, 16000 Auto Refractrometeries and 700 hours of clinical teachings for phase II MBBS students upto 31th December,2021.

The departments imparts trainings to two batches of Diploma Ophthalmic Assistant students and in the current year IInd year batch have cleared part II examination and Ist year batch of about 20 students promoted to the II year.

In the current year clinical teaching of phase II MBBS students is in progress and about 700 hours of clinical teachings have been imparted to the students.

In the coming months the department expects phase 3rd MBBS students for clinical and theory teaching and in the present scenario of only two faculty members in the department, it will put an extra burden to run the academics, OPD, IPD and Theatre. The department looks forward for enhancement of faculty Senior residents and Junior residents to overcome the departmental needs of academics and patient management.

The department entertains patient of Cataract, Glaucoma, Oculoplasty, squint and Medical Retina. The department has manpower of one Associate Professor, one Assistant Professor, three Senior Residents and two Junior Residents, four ophthalmic assistants. To improve the service in the department it definitely requires manpower augmentation of faculty, Senior Residents and Junior Residents and department is in dire need of Diagnostic gadgets like OCT (Optical Coherence tomography, Humphrey's field analyser and fundus Angiography to take academics and patient care to the higher level. The department is in dire need of teaching operating Microscopes and other surgical instruments to widen the spectrum of surgeries.

Under the present leadership of worthy Principal, Prof Dr.Ruby Reshi we definitely have high hope that she would take the departmental activities to new level by augmentation of manpower, space and Equipments. Under the guidance of Prof. Dr. Ruby Reshi the department will definitely take new heights by her dedication & sincerity.

Even with Covid-19 outbreak at the very inception of this institution, we have successfully and safely re-engaged students and patients while we still remain vigilant in our efforts against the pandemic. It will be our constant effort to train competent, compassionate and caring physicians through excellence in teaching, patient care and research. Blood Bank provides 24x7 transfusion services to everyone after proper screening and compatibility testing.

The Department of Pathology & Blood Bank supports the common vision of GMC Baramulla to provide accessible, affordable & appropriate health care to the rural population and to train young doctors and technicians in the community oriented approach towards medical care. The vision reflected our commitment to excellence in:-

- Providing affordable services to the rural population.
- Training & teaching Pathology to UG's & paramedical students.
- Clinical & Basic research appropriate to local needs.

Since the inception of the college, department of Pathology has worked tirelessly to improve patient care & impart education to both medical & paramedical students. The Blood Bank is with enough space for routine Blood Bank work, including counseling, donor screening, phlebotomy, storage, TTI screening (By Elisa Method), cross matching & component separation.

At present whole blood facility is available and component separation is under process and the facilities like PRBC's, PRF's, FFP's, Cryoppt will be made available for the hospital at the earliest after proper license approval.

- We are giving 24 hours blood bank services to both Covid & Non-covid patients.
- Emergency Laboratory services 24 hours for both Covid & Non-covid routine patients.

The blood bank is equipped with all the latest equipments like:

- Cryofuge, cryobath, platelet agitator, plasma expresser, Elisa reader & washer, deep freezers, refrigerators etc.

We have a well trained staff to run the department (both blood bank & component separation).

During Covid Pandemic time despite of lockdown and other difficulties the department has done a tremendous work with total donation (2099), and transfusion (2085) with 12 Blood Donation Camps both in premises as well as outside the campus. (Approximately daily 10-12 donations & 8-10 transfusions).

The blood bank has total capacity of 1500 blood units.

6. To deal with the third wave of covid-19 and increasing number of Covid positive patients undergoing emergency surgical procedures, a separate OT complex was started in January 2022 for Covid positive surgeries.
7. BLS (Basic life support) training is being imparted to all Doctors/Paramedic staff of Government Medical College Baramulla every week in the Department of Anaesthesiology.
8. The Department is giving bedside teaching to diploma and BSC students.
9. The Department is doing a commendable job by providing ultra-sounded guided blocks to the patients for Anaesthesia and post Analgesia.
10. The Department is providing services to the patients who are in need of central line monitoring for Dialysis.
11. The Department is rendering emergency services in the causality round the clock.
12. The Department also provides services to the ward patients where emergency intubation/resuscitative monitoring needed.
13. The Department is also rendering support at Covid-19 sample collection Centre and CC1 for RAT testing.

Radiation Oncology

The department of Radiation Oncology at GMC Baramulla is in its infancy. In a very short span of few months and with extremely limited infrastructure, we have been able to provide OPD and Daycare Chemotherapy services to the patients suffering from various cancers. We are expected to cater to a population of 2276166 of two and a half districts of entire north Kashmir (2011 census) and more than 20% of all cancers diagnosed in the valley (Population Based cancer registry).

We held a successful Awareness programme on Breast Cancer in the month of October where women from various government and non-government departments participated and were provided with awareness about the early detection of Breast Cancer.

Recently a two bedded Daycare ward was inaugurated and dedicated to the patients by the worthy principal and patients suffering from various cancers have started to get benefitted.

We envision our department to provide exceptional clinical care, to become an excellent academic unit, by starting MD and DNB programs and to establish a comprehensive Radiation Centre so that it is comparable to any developed Radiation Oncology center, not only at the national level but at international level as well.



Department of Biochemistry

The Department of Biochemistry is an integral and a vital component of Medical Education, Diagnosis and Healthcare Delivery System. Our vision is based on the “Next Generation-Level of Medical Education”, aims to disseminate knowledge and promote academic excellence to achieve individual goals. The objective is to establish a stimulating, challenging and nurturing learning environment for biochemistry students in the department with an interest of qualifying high standard medical examinations in future at state, national as well as international level (USMLE Step-1 & Step-2 or other North American Standard exams). Our teaching methods/or aids are highly innovative based on new NMC pattern (both Vertical & Horizontal) problem based learning (PBL) that would provide students an excellent academic program to learn and share advancing knowledge about the fundamentals of medical biochemistry, a “Foundation-Subject” essential for learning other clinical subjects. We are thankful to the College Administration for creating conducive environment and much needed support for the successful development and furthering of Department of Biochemistry with all of its requirements and other initiatives that would help us to make it a fully established department with all world-class academic & clinical facilities. Even if the department is still working under “makeshift” arrangements since 2019, the following substantial progress has been made, as highlighted under following headings:

1. Presently there are two faculty members at the level of Associate Professor & Assistant Professor and four Tutor Demonstrator working in the department of Biochemistry.
2. All the Lectures are delivered as per the CBME and as per NMC approved time table .
3. MBBS practical Lab is equipped with the following equipments i.e, Spectrophotometer, ELISA Reader/Washing, Semi automatic Biochemistry Analyzer, Shaker, Microscope, Refrigerator, Distillation Plant, Hot Plate, Incubator and Hot Air Oven. The department has all the equipments to conduct daily practicals for MBBS phase-1 students as per given competencies.
4. For central Research Lab, GMC Baramulla a complete proposal comprising of all modern equipments for conducting both basic well as clinical research is in progress.
5. We are committed to patient care with rapid delivery of quality diagnostic evaluations, results besides dedication to teaching and mentoring the IMG for future.
6. The department left no stone unturned to beat the odds during the COVID-19 pandemic and in no time shifted to online teaching mode.
7. The department has successfully completed MBBS batch 2019.
8. The Central Laboratory within the Department of Biochemistry is the core facility of the institution that is equipped with the High- End instruments and other modern machinery for conducting all baseline investigations / services round the clock.
9. The department is working on the project of starting Online lab reports and upgradation of the of central diagnostic lab for NABL Acceradation.

Major achievements:-

1. The Department of Biochemistry has added new instruments like Spectrophotometer, BOD Incubator, Hot air Ovens to the laboratory.

2. The Practical examinations were successfully conducted under OPSE pattern as outlined by NMC guidelines.
3. The Central Diagnostic Laboratory is equipped with the two Robust Fully Automatic Analyzers, capable of performing 400 Parameters Per Hour, that helps to keep pace with the largely increased patient load even during COVID-19 pandemic and has been successfully working 24x7.
4. Besides Baseline Biochemistry Investigation, during year 2021-2022 department has started special investigations like D-Dimer, Ferritin, LDH, Total Iron, Phosphorus, Magnesium and PT/INR.
5. The two Fully Automatic 5 part and one 3 part CBC Analyzers are performing CBC test in 5 minutes with 23 Parameters. The department has started facilities of Digital HB meter and Digital Bilirubinometer for newborn babies.
6. In addition to the Fully Automatic Urine analyzer which has through put of 200 urine tests per hr one more urine analyzer having Through Put to cope additional of 500 urine tests per hr.
7. The point of Care Auto Analyzer was added for critical patient care and COVID patient for Blood Gases, Electrolytes and PT/INR in addition to two fully automatic blood Gas Analyzer.



Department of Physiology

Department of Physiology, Govt. Medical College Baramulla was established in December 2018 and the first batch of medical students was admitted in 2019 (Batch of 100 students).

The department of Physiology adopts blended approach in imparting medical education which is open to newer concepts in medical education as well as retaining the time tested teaching-learning principles .

The department of physiology is well equipped to impart good quality competency based medical education to phase I MBBS students and to involve them in different research activities. The department faculties have expertise in areas like autonomic function testing, electrophysiology, exercise physiology etc. .

Achievements:-

1. We have fully equipped Haematology lab to serve teaching and research needs of both students and faculty.
2. Departmental library has around 62 books available which include both national and international authors.
3. Recently we established clinical lab (make shift) in newly constructed building which is equipped with examination beds, various mannequins and latest instruments for teaching of various clinical examinations.
4. The faculty members are actively engaged in research work and have published various papers in national and international journals.

Apart from regular undergraduate teachings, the department of Physiology will provide clinical services by starting Automatic Function lab, Respiratory Physiology and integral Health clinic.

Department of Forensic Medicine

Forensic Medicine and Toxicology is a subject that includes: Forensic Medicine: Deals with application of medical knowledge in the administration of justice. Medical Jurisprudence: Deals with the application of knowledge of law in relation to the practice of medicine. Toxicology deals with study of poisons.

The department of Forensic Medicine & Toxicology in GMC Baramulla was established in August 2019. Presently the department is functioning from a makeshift arrangements wherefrom the functions of teaching and Medicolegal work is being carried out.

The department has a primary responsibility of teaching MBBS students and conducting Medicolegal work.

According to new NMC curriculum, the subject is being taught at two levels first in phase two and then in phase three part one. Thus the department despite the severe shortage of faculty and other supporting staff has to manage two MBBS batches of phase 2 and phase three part 1 at any given point of time.

In addition to teaching, medicolegal work is also being carried out the department, which includes post-mortem work, exhumation, and court evidence etc. The department is also managing some high profile exhumations and post-mortem cases from areas belonging to other parts of North Kashmir besides District Baramulla.

Presently the department is doing a study on interpretation and pattern of medico legal cases being managed in GMC Baramulla.

With the support of Principal GMC Baramulla we are in the process of near completion of having a well finished and distinctly equipped department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology which includes space for accommodating office chambers for the head of the Department, faculty members, and other members of the supporting staff and an extensive area for a laboratory, a museum and a mortuary.

Major Achievements:

- Teaching MBBS students.
- Medicolegal work.
- COVID duties.

The faculty member in the department is actively involved in medical education unit as its member.

The department is doing a study titled “interpretation and pattern of medicolegal cases being managed in GMC Baramulla.”



Department of Psychiatry

The Department of Psychiatry GMC Baramulla was established in January 2019 with the inception of the new medical college. Presently the department is running outpatient (OPD) services on four working days from 10 am to 4 pm, where patients are getting psychiatric consultations besides counselling and psychotherapy (in collaboration with MSF). The department has also started IPD facilities and six bedded De-Addiction Ward from January 2020 where patients with severe mental illnesses and substance abuse disorders are provided comprehensive treatment and care.

Present staff strength of the department:

One (1) Assistant Professor

Four (4) Junior Residents

Two (2) Medical Social Workers

One (1) Nursing Orderly

One (1) D.E.O

With the meagre manpower and space available at present, the department is providing the best possible patient care and in near future we should be able to expand our services further.

Our short term goals would be strengthening of already existing OPD services and starting speciality clinics like the Memory Clinic and ATF-Addiction Treatment Facility (in collaboration with NDDTC AIIMS New Delhi). In addition, we would be looking to introduce novel methods of treatment like ECT, t-DCS and r-TMS. In addition, department wishes to actively participate in all the academic activities of undergraduate students and is committed to impart basic knowledge of the subject to them. In our long-term goals, we progressively look forward to start postgraduate MD, and DNB courses, so that highly qualified mental health professionals will be trained. Lastly, the department would like develop strong cooperation with allied departments of the institute in order to establish highly integrated advancing centre for “neurosciences” capable of providing the best world class clinical facilities and services related to psychiatry, neurology and neurosurgery based on world renowned NIMHANS model. Taken together, with the support and cooperation of the Health and Medical Education Department, Government of J&K and the valuable support, guidance and much needed directions from Principal GMC, Baramulla, would greatly help us to make this department a centre of excellence at both academic as well as clinic front.

The department of General Medicine Government Medical College Baramulla (GMC-B) provides comprehensive healthcare services to the People of North Kashmir. With the ever-available support from administration, we promise to:

4. To encourage our staff and students to conduct meaningful and advanced research and to publish that accordingly.
5. To establish an advanced Endoscopy lab for various interventional endoscopic procedures (ERCP etc) for all the needy patients in North Kashmir.

We have a qualified, dedicated and committed team of doctors and other supportive staff to achieve these goals and objectives. The support and cooperation provided to us by Government of J&K and various authorities involved in establishing this mega project, particularly the Administration of GMC Baramulla headed by the Principal Dr. Prof. Ruby Reshi is highly commendable.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Department of Medicine, GMC Baramulla has been at forefront in Covid-19 pandemic. Besides running the non-Covid 19 services i.e OPD, Emergency services and Inpatient management of non-Covid-19 patients we have provided tertiary care facility for covid-19 patients in North Kashmir. We have managed **2970** admitted patients of moderate to severe Covid-19 pneumonic, and have treated thousands of patients on OPD basis.

In non-Covid-19 services, we have managed **71280** admitted patients over last one year. OPD services have been provided to patients. Dialysis unit has been functional all along, even during holidays and have provided HD to **3509** patients. In addition, department of medicine has done **322** endoscopies, **132** colonoscopies, echocardiography in year 2021. Lastly, we are running a 24*7 emergency services to tackle various medical emergencies.

Department of Anatomy

The department of anatomy is one of the first basic science departments to be setup in GMC Baramulla in the year 2018.

The department today is involved in medical teaching and training at undergraduate level and also provides education of Nursing and Paramedical Science students. We teach our students different branches of anatomy which include neuroanatomy, embryology, gross anatomy, microanatomy, osteology and radiological anatomy.

Achievement

1. We have completed almost 100% of theory and 90% of practical syllabus for MBBS first year.
- 2 Our department has acquired five cadavers for quality teaching of medical students.
3. Our department has got best models and specimens with which world class museum wouldbe constructed, once our department gets shifted to new building.
4. We have got good histology lab although we need to acquire more histology slides. As we don't have enough research facility available in our department, much research work is not done yet.



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Department of Microbiology

Introductory note:

The department of Microbiology like rest of the departments of the medical college is progressing towards excellence. The same is evidenced by the magnitude of the testing services being provided for the diagnosis of Covid-19 ever since the pandemic began. Other services although have been severely affected but they are being resumed slowly.

Achievements:

1. Establishment of Biosafety level-II laboratory at GMC Baramulla was milestone as the same is now necessary for admitting MBBS students as per National Medical Commission.
2. Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) for the detection of Sars-Cov2 since July 2020. More than 69,409 RAT tests have been performed till date and counting.
3. RT-PCR based testing for the detection of Sars-Cov2 for the samples from district Baramulla. A total of 3,28,735 tests have been conducted till date and counting.
4. Testing Capacity of RTPCR for COVID 19 has been enhanced to 2,000 tests per day which is highest among the newly established medical colleges across UT of J &K.
5. Whole genome sequencing of the emerging variants of Sars-Cov-2 through “The Indian SARS-CoV-2 Consortium on Genomics (*INSACOG*)” is being routinely carried out to identify and report emerging Sars-Cov-2 variants.



Department of PMR

1. Departmental Information

(i) Introduction

Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation is a newly created department by the Government for all the new Medical Colleges of J&K including GMC Baramulla. At present the department has only a small Physiotherapy section and is lacking in all other areas / sections. It needs to be upgraded and established as a unit of PMR department. MCI/ NMC has already made it compulsory for undergraduate teaching. The specific areas which need to be developed are as under:

1. Physiotherapy / Occupational Therapy Section
2. Speech Therapy Section
3. Vocational / Medical Social area
4. OPD area for Consultants, Junior / Senior Residents, Clinical Psychologist.
5. Ortho & Prostho Section.

7. Artificial Limb Centre
8. A ward of 30 beds for indoor patients
9. The Department is very important for providing multi-disciplinary services of patients which includes Orthopedically handicapped, rheumatological disorders, various brain and spinal cord diseases, speech disturbances, children with cerebral palsy and other disorders and treatment of pain management by various physical modalities.

- 3- Provide super specialist surgical services like onco surgeries (breast cancer surgeries, gastric cancer, colon cancer surgeries), neuro surgeries (burrhole drainage of chronic SDH, laminectomy etc), urological procedures (laparoscopic nephrectomy, laparoscopic pyelo lithotomy, CPE etc), thoracic procedures (AV fistula formation, T-Tube drainage, management of chest trauma).

We have qualified committed and dedicated team of doctors and supportive staff to achieve these goals and objectives and we have been able to achieve such goals under the guidance of our worthy Principal Prof. (Dr.) Ruby Reshi who has been always encouraging to achieve excellence both in academic and patient care.

Apropos to the subject matter and reference, the Government Medical College, Anantnag made a land mark achievement by starting Administrative Block of newly constructed Medical College at Dialgam. Four Departments viz. Accounts, Planning, Establishment and Procurement Sections are functioning since 28th December 2021 in the new Blocks. Even though the water supply and electricity are yet to be restored, the Departments are managing by alternative arrangements viz. Generators and Tube-well water. Rest of the Departments will be shifted in phased manner in coming weeks.

The GMC Anantnag has improved its surgical abilities and in this context, Department of ENT is conducting Navigational assisted Tumor surgeries which are state of art surgeries carried in Anantnag.

Apart from routine surgeries, the Department of Ophthalmology has started advance Phaco surgeries, Retinal Surgeries and Anti-Veg F injection. These surgeries are carried out routinely in the Department and earlier such patients had to be referred either to Chandigarh or Delhi.

The Department of Orthopedics is carrying Complex Spine Surgeries routinely.

The Department of Gynaecology & Obstetrics apart from routine surgeries and cesarean surgeries has started Laparoscopic Gynae related surgeries.



ABOUT GOVERNMENT MEDICAL COLLEGE, RAJOURI

- Rajouri District is one of the Major District of Jammu region. The district comprises of 05 sub-division, 13 Tehsils & 19 CD Blocks. The jurisdiction of this district is spread over an area 2630 Sq kms from Bhambla (Jammu District) to B.G on North west(Poonch District) and Sungri (Reasi District) to DKG on North-East of District H.Q.
- Government Medical College, Rajouri has been established vide Government of Jammu and Kashmir Order No. **675-HME of 2017** Dated:- **23.10.2017** with the aim to provide quality education and deliver the better health care services to the people of Districts of Rajouri , Poonch and Reasi. This institution is located 03 kms from the District Headquarters, Rajouri, 153 kms towards north-west of winter capital i.e. Jammu and 180 kms via Mughal road from summer capital i.e Srinagar.
- Since, the main campus of GMC, Rajouri at Mehra is under-construction, the first batch of MBBS course started since 2019 in the existing District Hospital Complex, Rajouri. A separate infrastructure consisting of two Lecture hall (gallery type) with seating capacity of 120 students each, Dissection hall of 250 sqm, four Numbers of Laboratories (03 of 150 sqm each & 01 of 60 sqm) & a Library of 400 sqm, has been created under make shift arrangements at the basement of existing District Hospital Building, Rajouri. Four buildings have been hired in the proximity of the District Hospital, Rajouri for providing residential accommodation to faculty and students.
